
Counselor's Corner Mrs. Janna Duerksen

BLUEBIRD GO! GOTTA SING 'EM ALL!

Each grade has been busy learning new songs and learning new concepts of music. Older students are also building on the knowledge from previous years.

Kindergarteners are studying fast and slow music. They have also learned about

four different voices that each child has and we've practiced using all of them (speaking, playground, whisper, and singing).

<u>First graders</u> are practicing solo sections of a variety of songs and finding which notes go in which direction in their songs.

Second graders have been matching words and rhythms and learned a dance to *Country Gardens*.

<u>Third graders</u> have practiced more complex patterns of melodies (up, down, stay the same). <u>Fourth and</u> <u>fifth graders</u> learn music theory at their own pace through *Music Ace* in the computer lab. They've also worked at developing a strong singing sound. Fourth graders are singing, speaking, and clapping rounds. Fifth graders are learning to sing in two parts and practicing a song by Mozart, *Alleluia*.

All students are learning to sight-sing using Kodaly hand signs. 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th graders are all practicing sight-singing do, re, mi.

- Where is the setting of the story? (Where does the story take place?)
- Who are the characters in the story?
- Did the character change during the story? How?
- How are you like the main character? How are you different?
- Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?
- What do you predict will happen next in the story?
- Is there a problem in the story? If so, what is the problem?
- What is the solution to the problem in the story?
 Can you think of another solution?
- Which part of the story was the most exciting?
 Why?
- What happens at the beginning, middle, and end of the story?
- Did you like the story? Why or why not?
- Can you think of a different ending for the story?
